Opportunity for Students to Speak on General Items

No students addressed the Board.

Opportunity for the Public to Speak on General Items As follow-up to the Board Policy Committee meeting, Sandra Gonzalez, York Haven, encouraged the Board to listen to the community, shared concerns for the safety of girls, and expressed concern for how bathroom use is covered in policy.

As follow-up to the Board Policy Committee meeting, Jay Hess, Etters, highlighted differences in meaning between the words sex and gender, encouraged the Board to do their research, and offered to provide his expertise for free.

As follow-up to the Board Policy Committee meeting, Heather Keller, New Cumberland, shared concerns about Board members focusing on "their" stakeholders, rather than the entire community, expressed concern about the source of policies Board members were looking at, and advocated for thinking about the safety of LGBTQIA+ students.

As follow-up to the Board Policy Committee meeting, Sandra McCarver, Lemoyne, shared her thoughts that the direction of the Board Policy Committee's discussion was good by the time the meeting ended.

As follow-up to the Board Policy Committee meeting, Margeaux Sandnes, New Cumberland, highlighted the importance of athletics and recognized the need for there a nuanced approach when dealing with sex-based differences in athletics.

Lisa Budwig, Lemoyne, shared concerns about items related to pronoun use and bathroom access on the Board Policy Committee agenda. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Tom Flynn, Etters, expressed concerns related to the potential of anti-LGBTQ+ policies shared in the *York Dispatch*. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Deb Gray, Camp Hill, expressed concerns about the issues in item 4 of the Board Policy Committee agenda. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Carol Helsel, Lemoyne, expressed concerns about the discussion of Sex-Based Distinctions in Athletics and Universal Bathrooms at the Board Policy Committee meeting. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Jennifer King, New Cumberland, expressed concerns related to sex-based distinctions in athletics and universal bathrooms as part of the Board Policy meeting. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Kim Patterson, Etters, expressed concerns about the York Dispatch article titled "West Shore to begin discussion of anti-LGBTQ+ policies." These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Mariana Reed, New Cumberland, argued against implementing universal bathrooms. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Jim Sawyer, Etters, shared his concerns about the potential of boys taking athletic opportunities away from girls. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Martha Uber, York Haven, asked questions about why the Board is discussing LGBTQ+ rights. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

Kirsten Youse, New Cumberland, shared concerns about the potential of adopting policies which are discriminatory towards students who are LGBTQIA+. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.

David Wilson, New Cumberland, advocated for allowing students to participate as their presented gender and allow at least one non-nurses universal bathroom in every school.

Joei Askey, Lewisberry, shared information about victimization of trans people and read a WSSD adaptation of *Letter from Birmingham Jail*. She provided *Letter from Birmingham Jail* to Board members.

Leah Cooper, Etters, shared her reaction to comments made at the November 21, 2024 Board meeting.

John Dewan, Lewisberry, shared renewed concerns of parking in the neighborhood by Red Land High School.

Sandra Gonzalez, York Haven, expressed concerns about coverage of bathroom signs at Red Land High School.

Bill Gramlich, Camp Hill, expressed concerns about boys/girls in sports/restrooms and offered learning opportunities for parents to learn about parenting and other issues from his church. The schedule of classes was shared with Board members.

Teri Mickle, New Cumberland, shared concerns about antagonistic topics being discussed, advocated for better funding, and encouraged the Board to demonstrate leadership.

Gabrielle Perkins, Etters, advocated for keeping everyone safe and putting the Bible back in schools.

There being no further business, President Brent declared the meeting adjourned. (8:26 p.m.)
