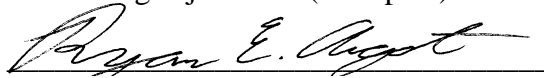
Allison Schoener, Etters, expressed her thanks for the communication and support for those making tough decisions. These comments were shared with the Board in advance of the meeting.
