## AMS PRINCIPAL'S 200 CLUB #mustangmojo

## Purpose:

The Principal's 200 Club is designed as a positive reward system to encourage and recognize students for meeting expectations and showing good character.

## Procedure:

1. School wide expectations, called Mustang **MOJO** and will be posted around the building and in each classroom. MOJO stands for:

Motivated
Optimistic
Joined Together
Openminded.

Teachers will take time at the beginning of the year to review what Mustang MOJO looks and sounds like around the building.

- 2. Each day the office will hand out 10 "Mustang Tickets" to randomly selected staff members throughout the building. "Tickets" will be placed in teacher mailboxes on the morning they are to hand them out. On the day a staff member receives a paw pass, they should award that pass to a student who is meeting ground rule expectations or showing good character. The office will keep track of who has received the passes, making sure that a variety of students have a chance to participate in the program.
- 3. Teachers should try to recognize as many different students as possible. We should try not to give a student more than one "Tickets" in a day. Teachers can monitor this by asking students. The PBIS Team will also monitor this as students participate.
- 4. During lunch, each of the ten students should turn their mustang ticket into members of the PBIS Team. If students receive a pass in the afternoon, they should the following day. When they arrive, the students will sign the "Principal's 200" guest book and randomly select a from 1-200. The student then places a ticket with their name on the "Principal's 200" board in the spot indicated by the number they chose. A congratulatory Connect-Ed call will be made each day to the parents of the students who received "Tickets."
- 5. The "Principal's 200" board will be displayed in the cafeteria to help promote the program and recognize those students who have already received "Tickets."
- 6. When the "Principal's 200" board shows 10 students in a row (either up, down, or diagonal), those students win the "Mystery Motivator." The "Mystery Motivator" will be an award either provided by the school or donated by local businesses. The prizes might be enjoyed by students while at school or out in the community. Once the "Mystery Motivator" has been revealed, and the "ten in a row" students receive their prize, the board will be cleared and we will start over.
