Congratulations to freshmen Naomi Englehart and Thussenthan Angelo-Walter. This dynamic duo took first place out of the nine teams competing through Cedar Cliff's gifted program in the 10-week online fall PA Stock Market Simulation. They took third place out of 230 teams competing in the region, going up against other schools in our area.

They started the simulation with \$100,000 to invest in the market. They ended with equity of \$111,174.97. Their highest earning stock was AVXL, a biotechnology company. Their highest percentage gain was a 25% gain in FBMS banking which went from \$22.22 a share to \$27.50 a share.

Others completed online coursera courses or online coding courses. In addition, students used their time to research and compete in the stock market game simulation. Students also focused on music composition, creating 3-D printing structures, perfecting college application essays, and researching scholarships. Students also discussed philosophical topics in a classroom setting focusing on *The Prince* by Machiavelli, Ayn Rand's speech *Philosophy Who Needs It?*, and the Growth Mindset.
