- Find a book about science experiments that interests you.
- Find a book about a topic that you dislike.
- Find a book about a topic that interests you.
- Find a book that is too hard for you to read alone.
- Find a book that is too easy for you.
- Find a book that you know all the words in it.
- Find a book where you do not know 2 to 3 words on a page.
- Find a book where you do not know 5 or more words on a page.

Reflection Questions:

From the books you gathered, what books would you actually read?

From the books you gathered, what books would you not read?

Were there any books that you would want to read together with your parent/child?





Instructions for the “Just Right” Books Scavenger Hunt

1. Go to a library or bookstore with your parent. you and your child should bring a bag with to carry your books!
2. Read through the scavenger hunt list, so you know what you are looking for!
3. Start with the first item on the list. Both you and your parent should go find a book that matches the first item.
4. Go to the section of the library that has the book you and your parent are looking for.
5. Once you find the book, each of you should put your own book into your bag, and put a check in the check box for that item on the list.
6. Continue on to the rest of the items on the scavenger hunt sheet and do numbers 4 and 5 for each item.
7. Once you have all the books in your bag, discuss the reflection questions together.
