Board Meeting

The Board met in study session on Thursday, May 9, with President Crocenzi presiding.

2019-2020 Adoption of Proposed Final Budget

The Board adopted a Proposed Final Budget for 2019-2020 showing planned expenditures totalling \$124,438,262.00. The millage rate for Cumberland County for 2019-2020 is 11.9487. The rate for York County is 14.6918. These rates represent increases of 2.6% in Cumberland County and 2.0% in York County. Individual homeowners can calculate the approximate impact of the increases by dividing the assessed value of their property by 1,000 and then multiplying by the millage rate.
