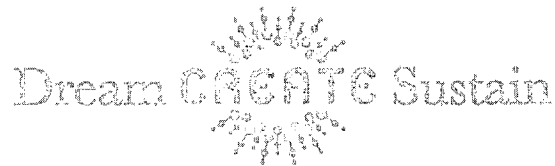


Scholarship Opportunities

- Our scholarships have the ability to be matched by the PATH program offered through PHEAA.

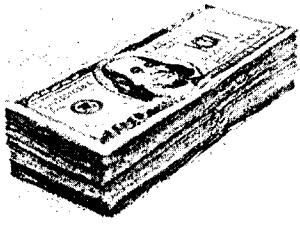

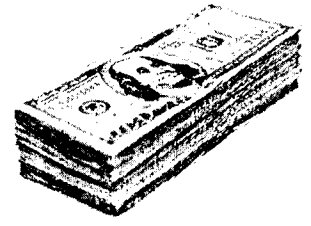

Scholarships Offered to YORK COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS

from The Foundation for Enhancing Communities



Ames Charitable Foundation: (March 15) for graduating seniors with a minimum 3.0 GPA, who are dependent children of associates of Ames True Temper Inc., and plan to attend a post-secondary educational institution (Varies/up to \$2,000 per year for up to 4 years)

Louise A. Dixon Memorial Scholarship Fund (March 15): for graduating seniors from Northern High School with a minimum 2.5 GPA, plans to attend any four year college or university or two year trade or technical school and evidence of volunteerism and/or extracurricular activities (1 winner/Up to \$5,000)

The Thad G. Gayman Memorial Scholarship (April 1): Graduating seniors from Northern York High School planning to attend a two-year or four-year college, university, or trade school as a full-time automotive technician student, Minimum GPA of 2.5 (1 Winner/Amount Varies)

Lou Drane Fund / Joseph L. and Vivian E. Steele Music Scholarship: (March 1) for students from Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, and York counties, studying classical music composition, teaching, and performance (Multiple winners/up to \$5,000 each)

Eash-Potter Scholarship (April 1): for The scholarship will support students committed to improving the campus and community climate for LGBTQ people (varies/amount varies)

Leader Scholarship Fund (April 1): for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Lancaster, or York county with plans to attend HACC York as a full-time student to study in their LPN program (Varies/Varies)

McInroy-Sheffer People Trust Scholarship: (April 1) for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Lycoming, Tioga or York counties, attending Mansfield University, York College, Central Penn College, Pennsylvania College of Technology, HACC, or Harrisburg University studying elementary education, culinary arts, communications, fundamental business operations, hands-on trades, nursing, management, or e-business (Multiple winners/up to \$2,000 each)

Sam Mizrahi Memorial Fund: (April 16) for graduating seniors from Northern York High School, with a minimum 2.5 GPA, who plan to attend a two year or four year college, university, or trade school (Multiple winners/up to \$1,000 each)

PARTS Scholarship Pennsylvania Automotive Recycling Trade Society: (April 1) for a child or step child of an owner who is an eligible active PARTS member or an employee who has worked for an eligible PARTS member for at least one year prior to March 15 or a child or step child of such an employee (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

Penn HOSA Foundation Scholarship: (March 31) for affiliated, paid HOSA chapter members by January 1 with financial need (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

Pennsylvania House of Representatives Scholarship: (March 1) for graduating seniors and legal residents of PA, with a minimum 3.0 GPA, planning to attend any 4 year college in PA, and demonstrating leadership and community service (2 winners/Amount varies)

Gary D. Radine Scholarship (March 15): for dependent children of a Delta Dental employee attending a two- or four-year accredited college as a full-time student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and participating in extracurricular activities, work experience, and community service (2 winners/\$5,000 each)

Melvin J. and Alice Gayle Reeder Scholarship: (May 1) for graduating seniors from Northern York High School (1 winner/up to \$1,000)

Rice Family Scholarship Fund of Eichelbergers, Inc.: (April 1) for graduating seniors who are dependent children of employees of Eichelbergers, Inc. (employed for at least one year), with a minimum 2.5 GPA, planning to attend any two or four year college in PA (Multiple winners/up to \$2,000 each per year for up to 4 years)

Matching Award Opportunities

TFEC is a partner with AES/PHEAA's "Partnerships for Access To Higher Education," or PATH Program. Scholarship recipients are eligible to have their awards matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by the PATH program. PHEAA may grant matching funds to scholarship recipients who are enrolled in an approved Pennsylvania college or career school as an undergraduate student on at least a half-time basis, who are a state grant recipient and who demonstrate financial need. Students must also be a resident of Pennsylvania, not in default on any educational loans, maintain academic progress, and not be considered an incarcerated student. The match provides last dollar support for tuition and fees. The scholarship recipient's information is submitted to PHEAA by TFEC staff.
