What is a Positive Behavior Support Program?

Focused on acknowledging students for consistent, socially appropriate, positive behavior.

Behavioral expectations are consistent throughout the school. Common routines and language are used in all settings.

Students are rewarded for exhibiting positive, sociallyappropriate behaviors.

Consequences are given when necessary and appropriate. Teacher-managed consequences are given to a student who has committed a minor infraction, breaking one or more of the school-wide expectations.

An office referral is completed for more serious behavior infractions. School administration meets with the student and appropriate consequences are given. The student's parent/ guardian is also contacted.

Panther of the Month Recognition

Each month Fairview staff recognizes students who show exemplary behaviors with important character traits that make each student an exceptional citizen. These traits will be taught through lessons provided by the counselor and content teachers.

During a recognition ceremony, each student receives a certificate to show them how proud we are of them. They also have their picture taken for display on the school bulletin board and webpage. Parents are invited to attend this special assembly.

** "Caughtcha" Making Fairview Proud

All students and staff at Fairview have the ability to receive Panther Tokens throughout the week for making good choices and making Fairview Proud. Students and staff place these awarded tokens in a large container outside the office. Once the Panther Container is filled, all students and staff will receive a school-wide reward.

Principal's 100 Club

When students are "caught" displaying exemplary behaviors in responsibility, respect, and safety, they may receive a yellow "Way to Go!" ticket from any staff member at Fairview. When a student is awarded with a yellow ticket, they report to the office where they sign Fairview's Celebrity Book of Fame and pick a number from 1 to 100.

Their name is placed on the 100's board in the office with that corresponding number. That student will receive a positive ticket home, a small prize, and their name will be read over the announcements. Once we have a complete line of 10 numbers, across,

up and down, or diagonally, each of those 10 students will receive a NEW and IMPROVED Fairview Principal's 100 Club t-shirt.

Our continued hope this year is to recognize even more students for exemplary behaviors. We hope to recognize all students each time the chart of 100 is complete by doing something special as a group.

Please be mindful, this program recognizes behaviors that go above and beyond the normal, daily expectations of Fairview Elementary School.
