The Board approved the student discipline recommendations as presented.

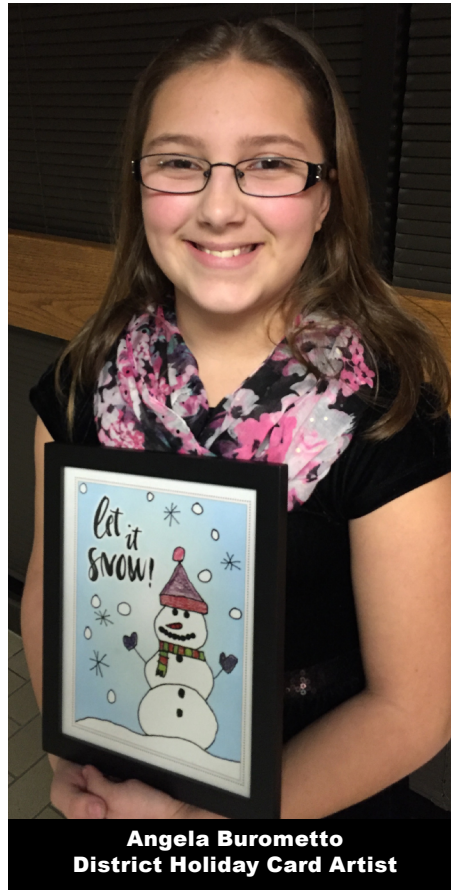
